

See people, cars, buses, motorbikes, pedal bikes, or even some animals from the farm next door.

See chairs, tables, vending machines, signs, lights, people, and staff members.



Hear people talking, fans, beeping from machines, a hoover.



Touch concrete, glass, wood, steel, plastic and maybe other people brushing past me.



Smell coffee from the machines, the chlorine from the swimming pool or cleaning supplies.



What to do at reception





- 1 I may have to wait in a queue if reception is busy.
- 2. I or the person with me will pay for our activity such as a swim, gym or class.
- 3. If I need help or do not like to wait, I or the person with me can ask for help.
- 1 will be given a wristband for swimming. If I don't want to wear it, the person with me can wear it for me.
- 5. I will go through the glass gates to my activity, and the gates may beep.



Before swimming





- 1. I need to find a free changing room, there are single changing rooms and family changing rooms to choose from.
- 2. I then need to get changed into my swimsuit or swimming trunks.
 - Once I am changed, I and my family who i am with will need to pop our things into one of the lockers available.
- 1 will need to Shower before entering the pool, there are open showers or showers with doors on. This helps keep the swimming pool clean for everyone.

See people in and out of the water, a small pool and a large one, a slide in the small pool in the shape of a crocodile, staff members, a large inflatable, coloured mats and toys, a lift poolside.



Hear people talking, shouting, laughing, the lifeguards whistle, an alarm, water splashing, music, the fire alarm and flashing, if this happens the person with me will tell me what to do.



Touch water on my body and head, tiles under my feet, the band on my wrist, goggles, ear defenders or a swimming cap if im wearing one. People going past me. My swimsuit or trunks against my skin.



Smell chlorine, this helps keeps the water clean.
